SB 5 Bond Measure: Rivers, Creeks, Lakes & Urban Streams

The Committee for Clean Water, Natural Resources, and Parks (CWNRP) members worked hard alongside state legislators to successfully pass SB 5, a bond measure that voters will decide in June 2018. If passed by voters, the SB 5 Bond Measure would provide to state agencies:

- \$174 million to various conservancies for river parkways projects, including projects that protect and enhance urban creeks
- \$3 million for Los Gatos Creek and Upper Guadalupe River Watersheds preservation
- \$3 million for Russian River regional management
- \$10 million for San Diego County river parkway projects along the Santa Margarita River
- \$20 million for City of Glendale river parkway projects along the Los Angeles River
- \$5 million for improvements in and around Clear Lake and its watershed
- \$10 million for the River Parkways program
- \$10 million for urban stream restoration
- \$10 million for the Salton Sea River Water Quality, Public Health, and River Parkway Development Program
- \$25 million for projects to restore rivers and streams in support of fisheries and wildlife
- At least \$30 million dollars to improve conditions for fish and wildlife in streams, rivers, wildlife refuges, wetland habitat areas, and estuaries
- At least \$60 million for protection of upper watershed in the Sierra Nevada and Cascade Mountains
